SECONDARY SUMMER SCHOOL July 7th to July 31, 2008. Day and evening classes.

MBIT is located at 2740 Old York Road, Jamison, Pa between Edison Furlong and Almshouse Road. For any questions call MBIT Summer School at 267.893.5710(after June 8, 2008), or email mbitsummerschool@comcast.net.

The Middle Bucks Institute of Technology Consortium offers remedial and enrichment courses for secondary students who will be in grades 7 to 12. Remedial students can attend one or two sessions, either from 7:30AM-10:40AM, from 11:10AM-2:20PM and from 5:30PM-9:30PM. Enrichment students attend class from 7:30AM-2:20PM except those taking .5 credit in Health and PE. There will be a break for lunch at 10:10 for enrichment students and at 10:40 for remedial students taking two courses. Students must provide their own lunch. There will also be a short break during each session. There is no transportation offered.

- **Register on line after May 1, 2008** at www.cbconline.com. Click on the MBIT Summer School icon. If you have taken summer school courses before, enter your email and password, If not please click on "New Sign Up". Enter the required information. The parent information is entered first and then the student information. Please make sure you choose the correct school district and school. Enter the course number and click on the student's name. If you need a second course, repeat the same process. Checkout by entering your credit card number and submit. Mail-in registration forms are available in your school's guidance office. Payment must be made in full at the time of registration. If you have questions or payment concerns please contact your school's guidance office.
- **Courses are offered pending sufficient enrollment and staffing.** Notification of course cancellations/changes will be received by July 3, 2008. If courses are cancelled refunds will be processed and mailed.
- **No refunds after Thursday July 3rd, 2008.**
- Students enrolled in Summer School are expected to attend all classes. Credit for Summer School is based upon clock hours and requires **PERFECT ATTENDANCE**. At the discretion of the Summer School Director under extenuating circumstances, two absences may be allowed for each course during the summer session. For an absence to be excused, a student must return from the absence with a signed note from his/her parent/guardian or doctor stating the reason for the absence. At the discretion of the Summer School Director, any student who is absent from three classes in any course, regardless of the reason, and will forfeit the course credit and related fees and will be removed from the class. Students who are repeatedly tardy may also be dropped from Summer School classes. Tardiness to class translates into a class absence in accordance with the following:
 - Up to 10 minutes late to class = 1 tardy
 - Up to 20 minutes late to class = 2 tardies
 - Over 20 minutes late to class = 1 absence

Students enrolled in Summer School are expected to attend all classes!

- Students who participate in the Summer School Program are required to follow the MBIT Discipline Code. The Disciplinary Code for MBIT is identical to Consortium Schools Disciplinary codes.
- Disciplinary actions may result in dismissal from Summer School. **No refunds for Summer School following disciplinary action are given.** MBIT and its grounds are smoke free areas. \$50.00 fines will be assessed and students may be dismissed for violations of this policy.

REMEDIAL COURSES

- Remedial courses are designed for students who **need to repeat a course not successfully completed** during the school year. **These courses are NOT for initial credit.**
- These courses are aligned with the Central Bucks, Council Rock, Centennial and New Hope-Solebury curricula and will focus on key concepts. Credit will be awarded for successful completion of the course for students who have previously failed the course. These courses are appropriate for students who need to improve their grade in order to move to the next level. **Remedial courses are offered in Sessions 1, 2 and 4. Enrichment courses are offered in Session 3 only. If a block is shaded, that course is not offered for that school district.**
- Tutoring to make up lost time due to a planned vacation is not an option.
- Rates for students not enrolled in one of the participating consortium schools for all courses will be \$50.00 higher.
- Remedial students can attend one or two sessions. **Report cards for Science and English courses taken in Summer School will be sent to the student's home school with the name of the course that was completed unsuccessfully during the school term.**

Remedial students can attend session 1, 2 or 4 if the course is offered in that session. Look for the session number above and the courses offered within that session below to determine offerings. Students may attend both sessions to meet their remedial requirements. Enrichment students attend Session 3. Fitness classes have flexibility due to hourly/credit requirements.

There will also be a short break during each session. **There is no transportation offered.**

If you have taken summer school courses before, enter you email and password, If not please click on "New Sign up". Enter the required information.
