DETAILS:

Central Bucks School District was awarded a Pennsylvania Department of Education Classrooms for the Future grant to increase student achievement and success by providing state-of-the-art equipment and enhanced teacher development. Central Bucks received a \$1.3 grant in order to transform its science and math classrooms through this project. In the 2007-08 school year, over 4,000 students will benefit through this initiative. 86 teachers were equipped with a promethean board and multimedia work station.

Classrooms for the Future is Governor Edward G. Rendell's initiative to put a laptop computer on every high school English, math, science and social studies desk and to provide teachers with a multimedia workstation and intensive training to enhance education. By the end of the current school year, Classrooms for the Future's \$130 million investment will have reached 356,611 students and purchased more than 100,000 laptops. The 2008-09 budget provides \$90 million for equipment and \$20 million for intensive teacher training to continue expanding the program.
